Call to Order and Invocation

Dr. Braddy called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. and called on Terry Baskin for the invocation.

Approval of Agenda

Dr. Braddy presented the agenda. After a general discussion, upon motion by Mark Christmas, seconded by Terry Baskin, it was unanimously:

RESOLVED: That the agenda be approved as presented.

Dr. Braddy presented the consent agenda. After a general discussion, upon motion by Mark Christmas, seconded by Terry Baskin, it was unanimously:

4. ToTo Bond Update

Authority counsel reported that the bonds had been validated. Bond counsel is waiting for Toto's signatures on the closing documents.

NEW BUSINESS

5. **Insurance Renewals**

Authority counsel reported that the quote for the 2024-25 renewal of the Authority's general liability and directors and officers. The total is \$25,512.16, including terrorism coverage. After a general discussion, upon motion by Emma Godbee, seconded by Terry Baskin, it was unanimously:

RESOLVED: That the 2024-25 renewals be approved, and the officers be and hereby are authorized to pay the premiums in the total amount of \$25,512.16.

6. 1630 Phoenix Blvd Repair/ Replacement Requests

Dr. Braddy discussed four (4) requests to approve extraordinary expenses submitted by the project manager: repair and replacement of two (2) HVAC units, a mandatory elevator upgrade required by a change in the Code, plumbing repairs, and utility reimbursement. The Board discussed each request individually. It was the consensus of the Board to direct the project manager to use Clayton County businesses when feasible.

After a general discussion, upon motion by Randy Burton, seconded by Rodney McDaniel, it was unanimously:

RESOLVED: That the replacement of two (2) HVAC units is approved, in the total amount of \$27,000.00 (\$13,500.00 each).

RESOLVED: That the plumbing repairs be approved in the total amount of \$3,755.99.

After a general discussion, upon motion by Randy Burton, seconded by Don Craddock, it was unanimously:

RESOLVED: That the utility reimbursement be approved in the total amount of \$3,233.04.

7. 5711 Jonesboro Road Report

The Authority discussed the storm drain repair proposal from Ranger Services, LLC, quoted at a cost of \$76,712.73. After a general discussion, upon motion by Randy Burton, seconded by Don Craddock, it was unanimously:

RESOLVED: To inquire whether the Clayton County Water Authority can complete the repair, with the cost to be paid by the Development Authority, but if not, then the repair by Ranger Services, LLC, be and hereby is approved, and the officers be and hereby are authorized to pay the cost in the total amount not to exceed \$76,712.73.
